Reservists are an important and integral part of Team Coast Guard. They are directly involved in supporting all mission and program area. They typically serve or train on weekends, augmenting the availability and presence to the public of the regular full time Team Coast Guard members. These "part-time force augmentation professionals" conduct inspections, investigations, vessel boardings, as well as stand duty and receive training. The availability of these civilian skill sets, experience, and local knowledge help increase the expertise and capacity of Team Coast Guard to respond to both routine and non-routine incidents, as well as enhance the ability to handle emergency situations in a timely, professional and quality manner.
